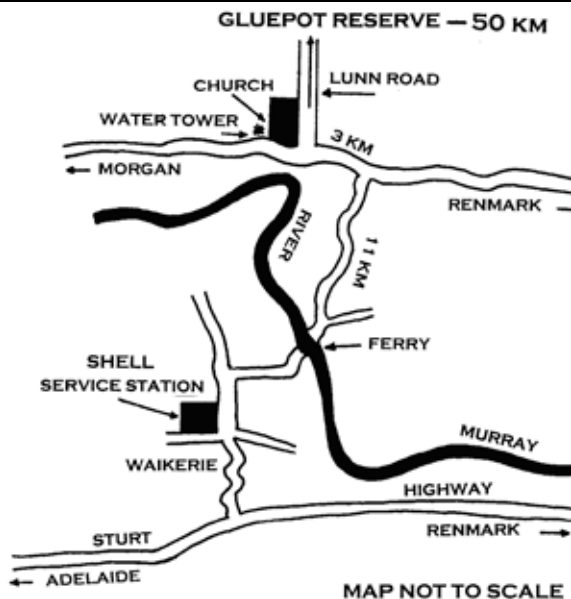


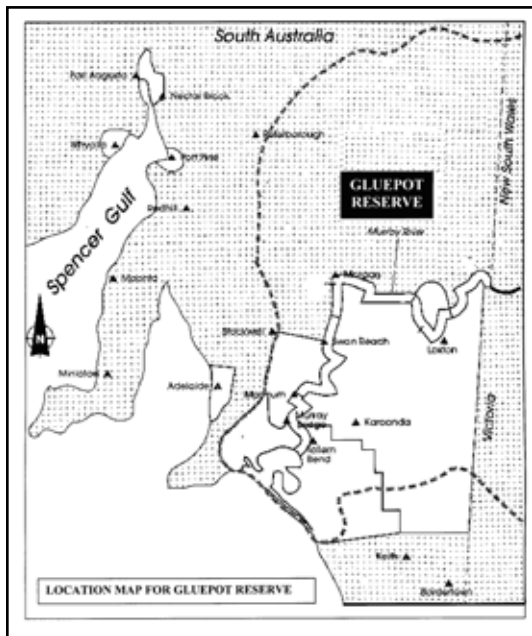

Accommodation at Gluepot:

Although accommodation is available at Waikerie, it is 64km away (1 1/4 hours travel) so we suggest you camp at the Reserve as your best option. There are three camping grounds to choose from and you will need to be fully self-sufficient in regard to your camping equipment, water and food supplies. The camping grounds provide well-spaced sites that are suitable tents, caravans and vehicles. Toilets are provided at each camping ground but power is not available. The Reserve has an excellent, well maintained track system suitable for 2 WD vehicles and mountain bikes. Course fees include camping fees.



- DIRECTIONS TO GLUEPOT RESERVE**
1. TURN LEFT OUT OF SHELL SERVICE STATION.
 2. TAKE FIRST TURN RIGHT TO FERRY.
 3. AFTER FERRY CROSSING, FOLLOW BITUMEN ROAD TO MORGAN/RENMARK ROAD — 11 KM.
 4. TURN LEFT AND TRAVEL 3 KM TO CHRISTADELPHIAN CHURCH ON RIGHT - LUNN ROAD.
 5. TRAVEL 1.5 KM DOWN GRAVEL ROAD TO FIRST GATE.
 6. FOLLOW SIGNS TO GLUEPOT.



What you will need to bring to the course:

A hat and sunscreen and some warm clothing as we will be heading out early on the Sunday morning. A notebook will come in handy during the lectures and a pair of binoculars may be useful.

What photo equipment you will need.

The course is designed for photographers so bring your camera whatever you shoot- film, digital, SLR or compact and make sure you pack your camera's manual. A tripod is handy for any macro and landscape work and a spare battery and plenty of storage as we spend a bit of time in the field each day shooting.

About Gluepot

Gluepot Reserve is a 54,000ha conservation reserve situated 64km north of Waikerie in South Australia's Riverland district. Gluepot was purchased by Birds Australia with the aim of "effectively managing a large, internationally significant area for biodiversity conservation". Among the 18 nationally threatened bird species resident on Gluepot are Black-eared Miner, Redlored Whistler, Regent Parrot, Striated Grasswren, Major Mitchell's Cockatoo and Malleefowl, that are only a small section of the 190 bird species recorded there so far. There are few areas of the world that support such a concentration of threatened species.
